President's Report — December 2016

Since the election the committee has met once and there have been a few executive meetings to examine the tasks facing us for the future and to set priorities of a number of items.

At the committee meeting portfolios were allocated to spread the load. You will receive an immediate reply as each committee member has volunteered to be the one replying for any given month.

From now on committee meetings will take place at Wadham House, 52 Wadham Parade, Mount Waverley. This is about a one minute walk north of the Mt Waverley railway station. They will be held on the third Friday of the month at 1.00pm. Financial members may attend as observers.

Help Needed

There are several important issues for which the committee will need help from all of you.

For finding speakers

One is to find speakers for the main monthly meetings. If anyone has any contacts, please let us know.

For finding editor / assistant for PC Update

The main and most urgent problem is to find volunteers to help in producing PC Update. If you are reading this in PC Update, this is the very last issue unless some members come forward. If someone is experienced in producing even a small newsletter then please step up. There is shared content available from APCUG (Association of Personal Computer User Groups). Also some Melb PC members often contribute articles.

Finally if you do come forward there is a very good possibility that the committee will authorise a small payment for your services.

Attracting new members

One of the many problems Melb PC has to face is the decline in memberships. I have a suggestion on how to find new members at essentially no cost. In the past we have spent \$22,000 on advertising for a number of weeks in the Green Guide and less than 20 new members joined as a result of these ads. Not a good investment. Later we tried advertising of the radio using a radio station whose listeners are in our demographics. Having spent several thousand dollars, we had less than a dozen member joining. Again, not a good investment.

In my opinion, we cannot afford to spend money on advertising while we are losing money. However, I have an idea that should give us good coverage for no cost. You are wondering "What's the Catch?". It will require some work from a couple of committee members and input from many current Melb PC members.

What I propose is that all SIG leaders ask our members to write (say) 200 to 400 words about why they belong to Melb PC, and include two photos of themselves, possibly near a computer. Then their article and photos, edited as required, will be sent by the committee to their local paper.

Having only a few stories for all of Melbourne probably wouldn't be enough as just one article generally would not be adequate. We must have material to be able to repeat with more stories at least monthly for a few months. Then we may have a chance of attracting new members. Please write to committee@ melbpc.org.au with any story about yourself and/or your Melb PC friends.

There is a good chance much of this material will be published as the newspaper editor does not have to go and look for a story to create content. This idea also represents a cost saving for the newspaper as they avoid having to pay a photographer.

Accessing your member Information

It's amazing that many Melb PC members are still unable to access their membership information simply because they don't have a regular Melb PC username. I'll explain how it works and a little bit about how we got there.

Some of the finer historical detail here might be a little off the mark because I wasn't personally involved in this next bit — I'm reporting from what I learnt upon returning to committee at the end of 2014. Had I thought of this before the 11th hour I would have asked Harry Lewis for his input but it's too late for that. Harry was deeply involved in this.

Going back a couple of years we stopped running our own email system and after much deliberation settled on using the services of Microsoft who was offering NFPs (Not For Profit organisations) free use of its new email server, Outlook.com. If I recall correctly Outlook.com grew out of the free email system Hotmail. Anyway, if you had a Melb PC email address it now lived on a Microsoft Server. That situation lasted for about a year until Microsoft changed the rules and essentially forced us to move our email to its new Office365 setup.

Along the way we got into bed with Microsoft and made further use of its facilities. Whether or not we took off our PJs I don't know, but we ended up in a situation where all members had free use of the Office365 facilities. All we had to do was sign in as a Melb PC member and we had free use of a number of tools and facilities.

One of those facilities is the discussion forum named yammer — which we have used to replace our old newsgroups which died when we moved our gear from the hosting site at Burnley over to Moorabbin — into our own building.

Another handy feature is OneDrive, a free storage area 'in the cloud' which gives each member many gigabytes of free storage space.

There is a webmail server for those who chose to make use of the free email service and there are many Microsoft programs available to be used freely while you are logged in. Have a look at the Office365 Pro Plus application on page 24. You will see the list of programs, most (or all) of which are available to be used freely online; Word, Excel, OneNote, PowerPoint, Outlook, Publisher, Access — I don't use any of them but it seems many members are taking advantage of their availability.


Why we must Log In

In order to make use of the Microsoft facilities, all we have to do is log in, just like any other members only service. However, when we rebuilt our website, early-mid 2015 we had the need for a members only area in there as well. It's quite normal for a club, or in this case, a website. On our website you will find financial reports, the minutes of committee meetings, our newsletter and other members only material. It was decided that since all members had to login to Office365, we should utilise the same login for the website.

So, the upshot is that when as a member I wish to read some of the financial reports, or download the newsletter, I log in through the same Office365 system.

Some people have been heard to say "I don't want to use Microsoft for my email". Well, you can if you wish but you certainly don't have to. The fact that our login name doubles as an email address is quite irrelevant to the common problem of gaining access to what is rightfully ours. I hope that's all clear because I have run out of space.

Random Access

John Swale reports on Questions and Answers from the opening session of the November monthly meeting and from members' written submissions.



Ouestions and **Answers**

Q: I need help with Outlook 2016 and Telstra. Telstra told me they were going to Telstra mail and to create new account and set it up with IMAP. They said once that was done I should delete the old account. I went into Outlook and deleted the old account but I still have the old account address sitting on the top. And the other address with (1) sitting in the inbox column and I can't work out how to get rid of it.

A: I don't run Outlook 2016. Normally in Outlook you go into Accounts and right-click the account and select delete. If the old account is the default, change the default to the new account and then delete the old one.

Q: I have a Kindle reader on my PC which I use by clicking an icon. I also have a Kindle Paperwhite which had the battery go flat. I charged it and when I started it there was a message asking if I wanted to upgrade. I foolishly pressed Yes without investigating and it now has deleted the desktop version. I tried to download it but it says it in not available for my machine as it only works on Windows 8 and 10 and I am running Windows 7. This only happened a short time ago and I have not found any solution.

You will have to open a virtual PC. The easiest one is VM Ware free player. You can then load a version of Windows 8. There is a website oldversion.com which may have the old Kindle software.

Q: I have recently had an email from my service provider, Westnet, advising me that NBN is coming. to me soon. What are the implications? Can you tell me what I should do? This may be a topic for a monthly meeting.

A: You can do nothing and your current internet service will not disappear. There will be a cable come to your house or maybe inside your house. You can do nothing but it may be to your advantage to do some shopping around because may other people will be able to supply internet and phone service on the cable. A few days before the physical connection you will probably get several letters with offers of "good deals for you". Again, you can do nothing but try talking to Westnet. Say you have been offered some better deals but would like to stay with Westnet and see what they will offer. You will almost certainly be offered a good deal. I recently was connected and I wanted to stay with Optus because I had a good deal. When I rang them and asked what else they could offer, I finished up with some very good extras including three months free. You will get a new modem which has a socket for a phone. Unplug the old phone and plug it into the new modem. The only issue is that if the power goes off the phone will not work. So you will need a mobile.

Unanswered question:

Q: Do you know how to connect Gmail to Office Outlook? I have had a connection and it made a 4.5 GB PST file and the system runs very slowly. I think there is a way of culling the Gmail connection.

Environment: Windows 7 with Access 2010 and Excel 2010

During our meeting:

- We had a database with the file containing the queries/forms etc being (a large) 140mb. The suggestion was that deleted objects may be remembered by Access.
 A possible solution create a new database and import all the objects from the inflated database. The first import reduced the database to 90mb, further testing will be conducted.
- 2. A secondary form was desired to always open in the same location.
 - a) Write code to position the form. This would be quite complex.
 - b) Activate the form properties Popup and Modal. When the designer saves the form on the screen where desired AND prevents the user from saving the form, the form will always open in the same screen location.
 - c) Activate the form property, Auto centre = True. This was the solution chosen.
- 3. Excel: wildcard (tilde) ~. How may it be used. The tilde (~) wildcard character lets you search for characters that are used as wildcards. In the first example, an asterisk is included in

November 2016 Meeting report by Neil Muller

Meeting commenced, as usual with Q&A conducted by **George Skarbek**.

Q: My ADSL Wi-Fi modem keeps dropping off the internet. I can't work out why it's doing it as it seems to be random. Can you suggest anything?

A: The first thing you should do is contact your ISP. They can do numerous tests to resolve this type of issue. By looking at the logs they can determine whether your line into you house or your device is failing. As your connection is ADSL, it's possible that the rain we've had recently is the cause. It's possible that water in the Telstra pit has effected the connections.

Q: I've been copying files onto CDs for presentations and I find on the bottom of the screen a message tells me I've still got files to burn. I can't get rid of this message so what should I do?

A: This comes up in most Windows system so just delete it. The cause is probably one, but possibly more ini files which are not important.

Q: What is the maximum speed for the NBN? The top range for Telstra I read is a consistent 100 megabits/second so can I match that with the NBN and at what cost?

A: I see negligible difference between 25 and 50. The problem is the server you are talking to is not going to give you 25 megabits/second when there are a thousand people talking to it. Uploads however are much quicker. When overseas data is cached locally by your ISP, its then you will see the faster speeds.

Q: I often take my Samsung Android mobile phone to the library and use their free Wi-Fi. To use the libraries Wi-Fi I have to enter my library card number and then pin number. When I take my Android tablet and try to do the same thing it won't connect. The librarian said to go to yahoo.com and it will then connect to Wi-Fi. Can you explain what is going on?

A: As both are running Android they both should behave in the same way. (No one in the audience was able to explain this unusual behaviour)

George then discussed his experience following his recent connection to the NBN.

When the NBN arrives you should do nothing. You will almost certainly be contacted by numerous ISPs wanting your business. Look for the best deal and play one ISP off against the other to get the best deal. You should be aware that your existing phone will be connected to the NBN through the back of the modem. Unlike the old landline, when the power goes out you won't have a "landline" phone. Mobile phones will not be affected. I was surprised to find that I no longer had Caller ID displayed on my phone. Instead of the incoming phone number or caller being displayed, the display only showed "private number". This was changed back to Caller ID by contacting my ISP.

As George was one of the first from this SIG to be connected to the NBN, a number of questions relating to his NBN experience followed:

Q: Are you connected to the NBN via your Optus cable?

A: Although I'm with Optus, the NBN connection was via the Telstra cable. This probably came about as I didn't nominate my preferred supplier when the NBN was connected. I had both cables to my house, Telstra underground and Optus above ground.

Q: Is there a new cable in your house?

A: No, there were no new cables run to the house however new connectors were needed in the house. The old connectors were 30 to 40 years old so they needed to be changed. The installers ran 20 minutes of tests in the house to ensure all was working correctly. The system was signed off and activated before the installers left the driveway.

Q: Is your internet connection any better than before?
A: The deal I got was twice as fast for downloads and 5 times faster in upload speed. So the answer is yes.

Q: What about the cost difference?

A: Optus gave me \$250 off my annual bill. I still get free landline and mobile calls throughout Australia.

Q: I'm surprise they didn't use Optus' aerial cable to the house?

A: I had both a Telstra and Optus cable to the house. When the NBN was connected the connection was via the Telstra pit in the street which I assume is more secure.

Q: Is the cable fibre?

A: No, the existing cable into my house is coaxial cable. This is not the phone cable which was copper. Fibre is the cable that terminates at the various hubs with other cables branching out from those hubs.

Q: I thought they used copper for the last connection to a house?

A: I had an existing cable connection to my house in addition to the copper phone line so the coaxial cable is what was used for the connection to the house.

Q: Did your package include FetchTV?

A: No, because we already had FetchTV. Interestingly Optus gave us a free FetchTV box. As this box was not near the modem, they included 2 powerline carriers all this at no extra cost, so I can run Ethernet over 240 volt cables.

Q: What is your monthly limit?

A: It was 500GB /month but is now unlimited.

Q: What are you paying now?

A: I'm paying \$80/month now for high speed unlimited phone calls and no line rental.

Following Q&A **Trevor Hudson** gave a video presentation on "Things to consider when purchasing another monitor". Having just purchased a new PC, Trevor wanted to buy the best 24" 16:9 LED monitor with speakers he could for under \$200, to go with the new PC.

Trevor's video lists 16 features & specifications to look for when selecting a monitor. Using this list, he narrowed his search for a monitor down to 3 models requiring further evaluation: an ASUS VP247H, a Viewsonic VX2457-MHD and an Acer G237HL. Trevor compared these 3 monitors against his key criteria shown in tabulated form in the video. Finally he selected the Viewsonic VX2457-MHD which had just been reduced in price at MSY. Trevor's video presentation can be found on YouTube or Vimeo by searching for the presentation title above.

Before purchasing the Viewsonic, Trevor ran a dead pixel tester on the monitor in store to ensure there were no dead pixels. This was a key criterion for his new monitor. Trevor developed his tester which can also be found on YouTube or Vimeo by searching for the title "Dead pixel colour tester".

After the break **Stewart Bedford** presented "3D Touring with Google Earth Pro". Google Earth Pro is now a free product and a separate program from Google Earth. The Pro version is particularly suited for education, tour planning or for ones personnel memories. With Pro you can tour the earth, moon, Mars or the universe. For 3D touring you need a fast internet connection and a PC with a fast video card. There is no Linux version of Google Earth Pro.

Stuart then demonstrated how to fly around Melbourne in 3D, stopping at key Melbourne landmarks such as Flinders Street Station, St Pauls Cathedral, MCG, The Palais Theatre etc. To view these landmarks from different perspectives Stuart demonstrated the various keyboard and mouse controls available. 3D buildings shown in many of these flyovers are computer generated so may not always be a true representation of the real building. According to **Brian Heywood**, a number of cities, and Melbourne is one of the lucky ones, have been generated in true 3D using multiple image sources and rigorous photogrammetric techniques.

November meeting report by Paul Addis

The November meeting was the last for 2016. There will be no meeting in December, and our meetings will resume on the third Monday, January 16, 2017. We

have been able to get the use of the meeting room on our desired dates for all of 2017, except for April. There will probably not be a meeting in April, but stay tuned for further information closer to the date.

Nick Vespo's Linux News videos consisted of a series of short items this month.

First came the news that Microsoft has joined the Linux Foundation as a "Platinum" member which attracts a substantial fee. It seems that they are wanting to get closer to Open Source developers.

Security problems have been found in KDE Neon. It seems they may have left themselves open to foreign packages being installed on their server. They have rebuilt the distribution on the server and advised users to download the revised version.

The lowest cost phones from the Chinese company BLU have been found to have a rootkit pre-installed that makes them vulnerable to Man-In-The-Middle attacks. There is information on the Internet that tells users how to make the phones safe, but users are warned to remain alert to the possibility of a root-kit exploit.

Tails (The Amnesic Incognito Live System) is a privacy and anonymity focussed Linux distribution based on Slackware. It runs from a DVD, USB stick or SD card, and aims to leave no trace on the system that it runs on, and enables the user to surf the Internet anonymously.

The last item was about the 10 most bizarre Linux distributions (distros) — definitely not mainstream! A couple of examples —

- Fan distros devoted exclusively to Rebecca Black,
 Justin Bieber and Miley Cyrus take your pick.
- a command line only distro that wipes your HDD if you make a typing mistake. Only for command line gurus!

The Open Forum was deferred until after the presentation and social break. See below for a brief report on that discussion.

The main presentation of the evening by **David Hatton** was next — Ubuntu 16.10 with "The Budgie Remix". David showed a series of images from screen captures of a running system because his notebook and the projector were not speaking. It was not clear which of the two had the sulks.

David spoke about improvements in the Welcome screens of a number of distros, with a series of basic explanations that aimed at new users and/or those migrating from Windows. Included were screens showing the minimum requirements to run Ubuntu Budgie,

and a comprehensive summary of the hardware in use when using the live DVD/USB or running from a completed installation on hard disk/SSD.

When installed, the system takes about 4.5 GB of hard disk. It seems to work quite well, but has a few quirks. The starting screen was shown, with the default desktop. The system panel (like a task bar) is at the top, but can be moved to the bottom of the screen. The button on the left of the system panel shows the installed applications by category when clicked.

The applications are mainly Gnome 3 based. The file manager is fairly basic, and the text editor shows one of quirks mentioned before — changes to tab settings are lost (revert to defaults) when the editor is restarted.

After the social/coffee break came the Open Forum session. David started by thanking behind-the-scenes contributors for their contributions this year, especially **Nick Vespo**, **Paul Addis** and **Stephen Davidson**.

The primary purpose of the Open Forum this month was to seek the members'/attendees' views on the future direction of the group. A couple of ideas had been floated via the notice of meeting email. Ideas discussed included getting involved in promoting/explaining the uses for the Raspberry Pi and starting or reinforcing "Meetup Groups" in the local area related to technology. The general notion is to broaden our scope and attract new members.

The ideas were generally thought to be worthwhile, and were discussed at some length. One possible avenue to increase the groups profile was via activities in cooperation with the Yarra Valley Library, especially the Watsonia branch.

The evening finished with good wishes to all for Christmas and the coming year. A fitting end to a good year for the Northern Suburbs Linux Special Interest Group.

Yarra Ranges October Meeting 2016 report by **John Sapsford**

The meeting commenced promptly at 9.15 am with 14 members present. Our Convenor, **Bryan Paten** welcomed everyone to the meeting. We discussed plans for the Christmas breakup to be held on Tuesday 13 December. Brian then introduced a discussion about the Melb PC Annual General Meeting and election of Office bearers for the year ahead. He handed out voting papers for members to complete.

We had a discussion about computer equipment purchased recently. One member had bought a 24 inch (60cm) TV for approx. \$200 at Officeworks.

We then looked at an article entitled 'The Future'. It discussed the possible developments in the field of technology in the next 5-10 years. Topics covered included Artificial Intelligence, autonomous cars, Real Estate, electric cars, water, health, 3D printing, Artificial Intelligence, Business Opportunities, Work, Agriculture, Cryptocurrency, Longevity and Education.

John gave a short demonstration about the Microsoft Malicious Software Removal Tool. This has been a part of the monthly Microsoft updates since the introduction of the Vista operating system. The program runs in the background and is designed to detect and remove the most well-known instances of malware. The tool can be run manually by typing 'MRT' in the search box. It will perform a Quick or In Depth scan of your system. Shane gave us an introduction to batch files.

We then had a look at an article 'Disposing your PC'. It recommended wiping your files on your hard drive. Just deleting the files or formatting the drive is not secure enough. Data can be recovered. The solution is to use a specialist program that can wipe the entire drive by storing random data onto every part of it, multiple times. One of the best-known programs for doing this is DBAN, which stands for Darik's Boot and Nuke. It will wipe any hard drive. It only works with traditional drives and doesn't support Solid State Drives(http://www.dban.org/).

We then move on to discuss a way to know where a URL-shortened URL is Going to Take Me?

Sometimes URLs can be quite long. For example, here's a URL for a Google map of Microsoft's location in Redmond: https://www.google.com/maps/place/Microsoft+Corporation/@47.6435107,-122.1252991,15.88z/data=!4m5!3m4!1s0x0:0x1a52969ee03899e!8m2!3d47.6396259!4d-122.1283767 The problem with long links is that often they break when they're wrapped to fit a particular line length, window, or screen size, particularly when sent in an email message.

Enter "short link" services. They enable you to create a short, manageable URL that redirects to the longer one. For example:

https://go.askleo.com/msredmond

This is a short URL that takes you to the longer URL above. It's easier to type, easier to remember, and not prone to break in email programs and the like. The problem with a short URL is that it's not obvious where it'll take you until you click on it. In fact, they're often also referred to as "cloaking links", because they hide, or cloak, the final destination.

There are several sites that show you where a shortened link will take you. Some current services include: unfurlr.com GetLinkInfo.com URLUncover2

Each of these displays the target and some additional information about a short URL
